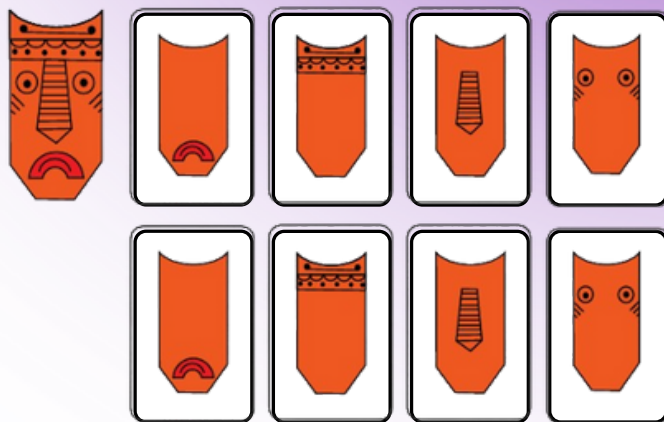


# **ABOUT GAME**

**Four Faces is a strategic memory-based card game in which players race to complete matching mask sets by carefully swapping cards with a shared center row. Each player is dealt four facedown piles of cards that cannot be rearranged internally, forcing players to rely on patience, observation, and recall as they swap one card at a time with the center. Only one pile may be handled per turn, all non-active piles must remain facedown, and completed piles are sealed with a mask card, locking them in place. Players cannot steal from others or move cards between their own piles, making every swap a calculated decision. When a player successfully completes and seals the most matching sets, and all completed piles are verified as correct, they are declared the winner.**

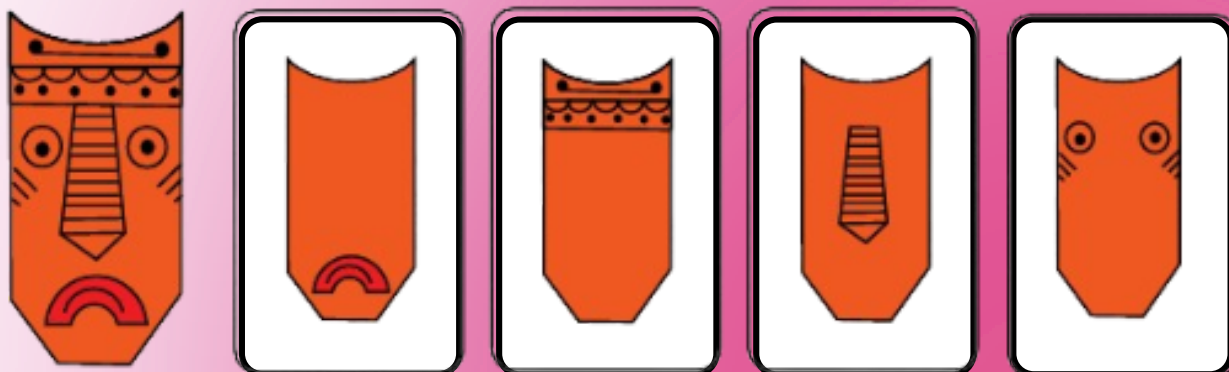
# BUILDING THE DECK

Eleven sets of matching cards are provided. A set consists of nine cards. Within the set, the colour are same but the parts are identical.

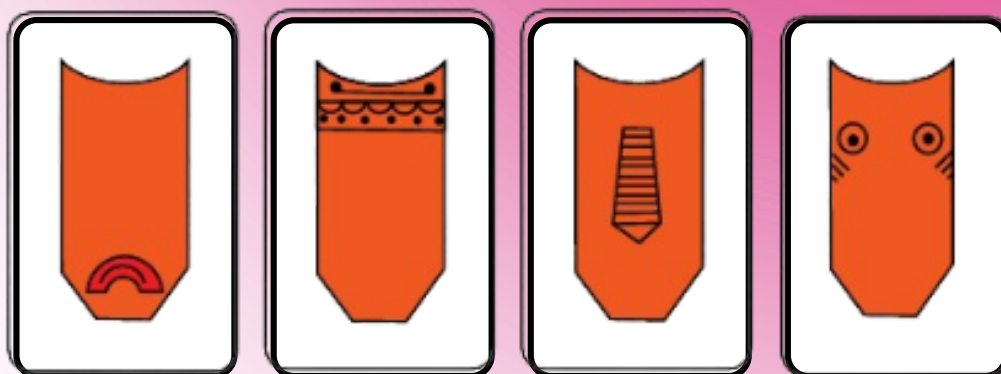


The number of sets you will use depends on the number of players. Take the necessary amount of sets for your player count and return the remaining cards to the box.

# GAME SETUP

1 Players sit in a circle.

2 The deck is built based off the number of players then thoroughly shuffled.

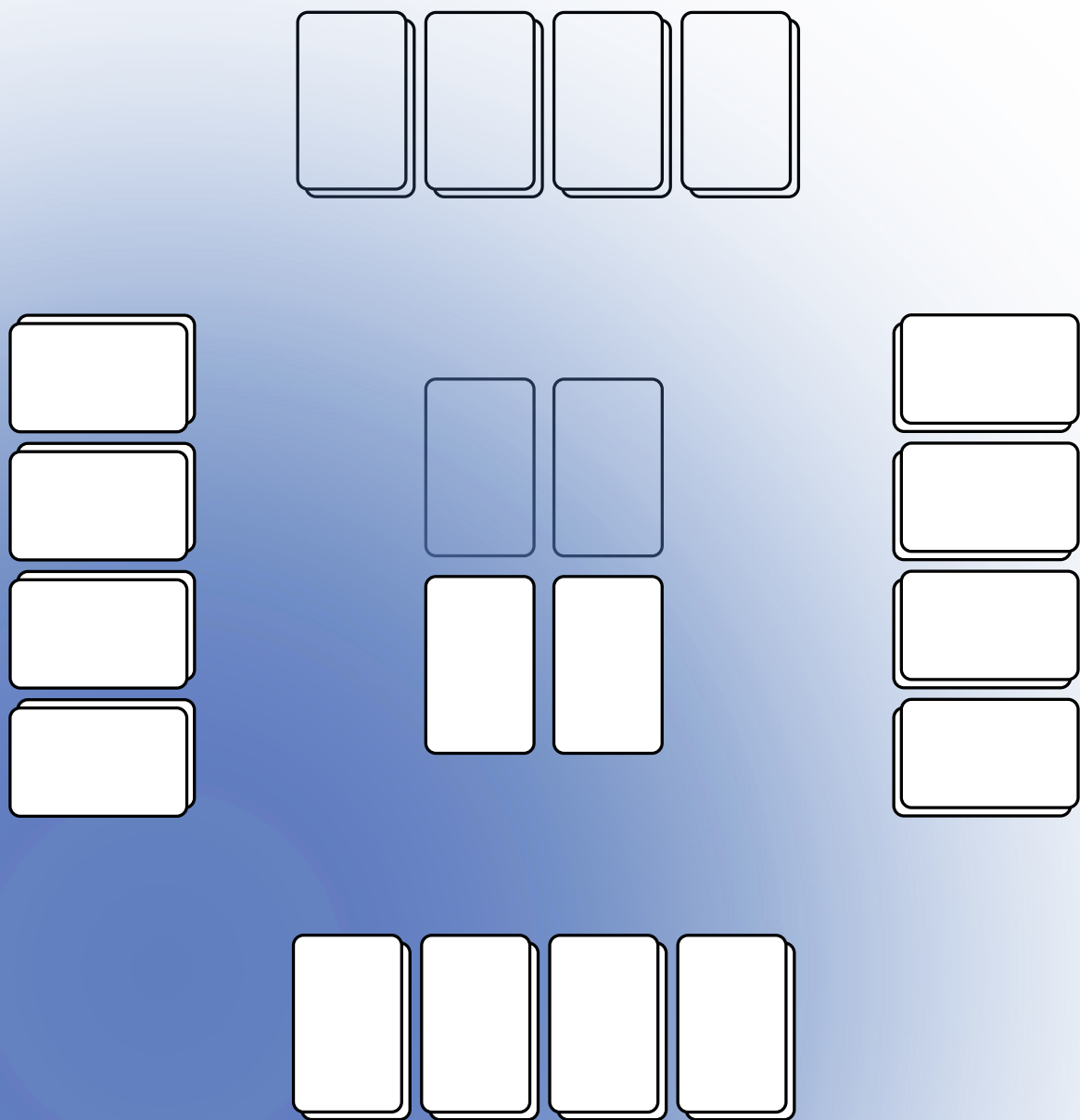
3 Each player is dealt four piles of four cards facedown.

Players are not allowed to swap cards in their four piles.

The piles are placed in a horizontal row before each player.

4 The remaining four cards are placed facedown in a row in the center of the table.

The center cards must be within reach of all players. Amount of sets for your player count and return the remaining cards to the box.

# HOW TO START

This game is played in turns. Patience and memory are crucial to success.

The game begins when the first player swaps one of their cards with a card from the cards in centre. Once the first player is done the second can repeat the same and so on.

## POWER CARDS



**good  
mask**

Once a player gets the good mask, he gets the advantage of taking a sneak peak of the remaining three cards in center and gets to choose one more card which he wants. As he is picking two cards he has to keep two cards from the deck as well



**bad  
mask**

Once a player gets the bad mask, he gets the disadvantage that he has to pick up all the remaining three cards in the center and has to keep his full pile in the centre. In this the disadvantage is that the pile in his hand which possibly was an almost completed pile, goes away from him and he has to start that pile from scratch.

# HOW TO PLAY

The goal is to turn all four of your piles into matching sets. You will swap out cards from your piles with cards from the centre. Cards can only be handled in the following ways:

1 You can only hold one pile at a time.

You can pick up your piles in any order.

You can rearrange the order of your piles.

2 You can only swap your cards with the centre cards.

You cannot transfer cards among your own piles.

You cannot steal cards from other players.



3 You can only swap one card at a time.

You must discard faceup.

You must discard to the centre before picking up a card from the centre.

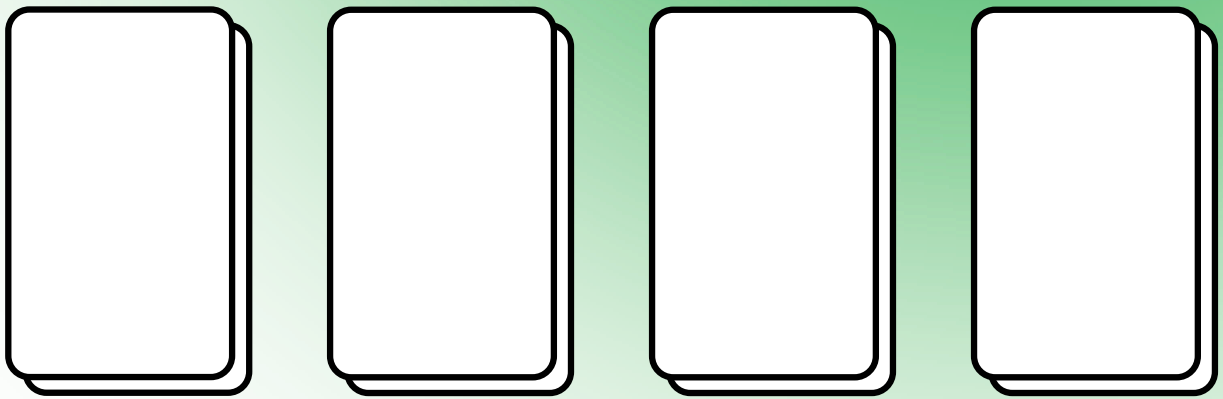
You can pick up a card you previously discarded

4 The piles you are not holding must always contain four cards.

5 The piles you are not holding must always remain facedown until they're a matching set.

6 Once you create a matching set, place that mask card on top to seal that pile.

# HOW TO WIN

Double check the winner's piles to make sure each one contains a full set. A mistake could've been made. If a mistake was made, instantly resume playing!

If one player completes a pile and places the mask card on top and seals the pile, then the other player has to give up on the set if he was making the same one and move on to complete the other piles.

THIS PLAYER HAS CONFIRMED THEY HAVE MOST COMPETED SETS, THEY WIN.
